Mick Hemmings

Racer, Mechanic 1944-2021

If you were to ever think of a racing Norton then you would probably think of the name 'Mick Hemmings'. Mick stood out from others by being a winning racer, gifted tuning mechanic capable of getting the most out of the Norton marque and someone who smoked like a two stroke.

It all started in 1969, when Mick bought a crashed Commando, rebuilt it, improved the tuning, handling, power and braking, launching him into scoring more than 50 wins over his racing career.

Later in life he closed his town centre shop to concentrate on engine and gearbox preparation from his enviable home-based workshop.

In 2020, when he was 76, he decided to further slow down by servicing and building gearboxes only.

If you want to grab yourself one of his bikes there's currently one for sale in the UK for £12,000, if you have the appetite (https://motorcycles-for-sale.biz/sale.php?id=55466

Norton Rides

Seven of us (myself, Neil, Phil Allen, Phil Burgess, Molly, & non-members Michael and Robert) had a great ride Sunday, avoiding any rain and soaking up what sunshine we found along the way! With beautiful autumn colours everywhere - it was certainly a great time to explore the hills!

We met at the Basecamp Cafe in Burnside and warmed up with a coffee before departing around 10:15. My original plan was to go up to Mannum, but after a drive the day before near Mt Bold reservoir, I changed my mind. So, we launched our journey by riding up Greenhill Road to Carey Gully, then taking a right onto Rangeview Drive and left onto Carey Gully Road to

Mt Bold Road was visually spectacular (even after the recent fires had gone through the area), a fun ride, and wonderfully bereft of cars. Mt Bold Road turns into Dorset Vale Road which ultimately ends up at Cherry Gardens after some tight and narrow uphill twisties.

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
