



Norton Story



Some years ago in 2016, my son Scott said he would like to run at the Sellicks beach races in 2017, and as my dad had raced there in the late 1950s it would be a tribute to him.

We looked around for a suitable bike, and as Dad have raced in 1930 Velo, we looked for one of them, to no avail. We settled on the 1950 Matchless we bought from a friend, which required a complete rebuild. The beach racing was fun, after which the bike was sold. I thought that was that.

When 2019 rolled around, we decide to do it again, this time on a Velocette. The bike was a basket case and lots of pieces, which with time, money and patience, we managed to make the whole again in time for the racing. Again we had a fun weekend, with a missed gearshift, an overrey, and a bent exhaust valve, we were out.

Prior to the races in 2021, and with a Velo now all good again, I thought Scott was having too much fun by him self, so that I should have a go. How hard could it be? I'm only 73 and it should be easy, right?

Now to need to do bike, to hadn't ridden since my old speedway days in 40 years ago. I purchased Norton ES to laydown gearbox from the swap meet and had a good start. A 1950 4ES to swing arm frame was for sale on eBay, up in Ipswich, Queensland, so I bought it and have it sent down. I then put together a set of road hold of front forks from some secondhand engine parts. Next came on wheels which I made up with a trying front hub and brakes, and matchless rear hub and brakes. secondhand, 19 inch rims with a new spokes and new Dunlop tires. The rest of the roller consisted of secondhand parts, mainly from Murray at British bikes.

Okay, all good so far but I don't have an engine. As the cut-off Sellicks Beach is 1962, and I like single cylinder 500, I start did to look for two valve, 50 speedway engine, which I found in Melbourne, but I had to buy the whole bike, which I did. After an engine rebuild, and a lot of hassle, the engine fitted in and I had a whole bike built from bits and ready to go. I didn't get to finish the two days of Celtics racing fit. Had a great time racing with my son. Welcome to 2023, I had taken the speedway engine out of the Norton frame, refitted it to the speedway chassis and sold it. DiVello is now retired from racing and rebuilt in Road twin , but what to do with

A mate, who is Dad James, to back Winn, had a engine in pieces under the bench, which I bought for \$500 for engine has now had a complete redo – as follows a new crankpin and balance, Arriba, with high compression piston and rings, a pair of racing cams from the UK, cylinder, head, inlet, porting, new valves, and springs, and polish, a new Mikuni 30 mil carb.

I've updated the bike with no handlebars and controls, a small fibreglass tank brackets from BSI), a small flat, racing seat, a remote guard from the speedway bike and go fast red paint. Scott will ride it this year, let's see how it goes!

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
