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Club Rego

Dear Club members,

As many of you will be aware the Government has changed the rules, from 30 to 25 year old vehicles eligible for club Registration.

It does not matter in which month it was manufactured, if it is 25 years old on the 1st Jan 2022 it is eligible, so that would be anything before 1997.

The new Code of Practice effective 1-7-2022 has become available. This has been emailed out so if you are interested then take a read.

Please keep in mind that the next meeting in August will most likely include the AGM which didn't happen in July.

If so, there will be *no* log book signing or MR 334 forms issued.

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


!!!!!! Logbook renewals for 2022/23 !!!!!!

Reminder to all members with Logbooks - please ensure you renew your Club Membership prior to August 30th and get your Logbook stamped for the new financial year . If your book needs replacing it will cost you \$5. Please present your old logbook at the time.

Logbooks are valid to 30th August each financial year . If your membership is not paid up by 30th August , your Club rego is not valid. The Club is required to notify the Govt of Logbook holders whose Memberships lapses more than 2 months in arrears , which may result in you losing rights to the Club Rego scheme .

There will be no logbook processing at the July meeting - its our AGM. You will be too busy vying for votes to be elected to one of the Committee positions up for grabs.

Logbooks can be updated at other monthly meetings or by Post to one of the Club Registrars. Please call Ian or Dave if you wish to arrange this.
